We have just completed another season of the *Aurora Youth Program*, having graduated 225 youngsters in the Metro New York area. It was your generous donations to our National Appeal that made this expansion possible. Over \$11,000 was raised to sustain the program. In turn, the expansion brought in pledges of \$8,000 from local legislators, merchants, and organizations. At a <u>per pupil cost</u> of about \$100, your Institute was able to bring the inspiring Italian culture and language to these kids. They have now received their foundation in foreign language at age 10 or 11. They are super-prepared to study all the Italic languages -- from Latin to Spanish to French, and of course, Italian. What an amazing bargain for everyone! We can't thank enough our *Aurora* staff, headed by Tony DeNonno and manned by Angelo Merenda and John Misso.

On a much sadder note, *Aurora* and the Institute recently lost a pioneer of the program, Janice Ricci. As a very close and dear friend of mine for thirty years and wife of our treasurer George Ricci, her untimely death at age 50 has stunned all of us. It was Janice who developed our *Aurora* recruitment strategy in which 5th and 6th graders in public schools were targeted. Janice's teaching background and her active involvement in PTA made for an unstoppable force in *Aurora*. Janice also sent her two sons, Andrew and Greg, through the program. In tribute to Janice, we have established the Janice Ricci Memorial Scholarship Fund to endow *Aurora*. Her husband George will administer the Fund. Your gifts to this Scholarship Fund, payable to ISI, will be a lasting tribute to her life.

# March Almanac

Named for Mars, the Roman god of war.

March 1 - Matronalia, the Roman celebration of marriage and motherhood. The classical Italians were the first to establish the social equality of women. On this day, husbands gave gifts to their wives.

March 6 - Renaissance artist and sculptor Michelangelo Buonaroti is born in 1475.

March 12 - American singer Liza Minelli is born in 1946.

March 14 - In 1861, Victor Emmanuel II is proclaimed King of Italy by the first Italian Parliament.

- Eleven Italian-Americans are murdered by a New Orleans mob in 1891. It is the largest mass lynching in American history. The U.S. Congress refuses to pay reparations to the families and the President has no choice but to pay a modest settlement from a secret account.

March 15 - Caius Julius Caesar is assassinated in 44 B.C. in the Roman Senate by opponents who wish to end his dictatorship. Italy is thrown into another civil war.

March 16 - Communist Red Brigades murder former Italian Prime Minister Aldo Moro in 1978. The atrocity galvanizes the nation and leads to the defeat of the Red terror.

March 18 - Antonio Salviati is born in 1816. He establishes the island of Murano in Venice as the center of Italian glass manufacturing.

March 19 - St. Joseph's Day, when the birds fly back to Capistrano, CA. The city was named by the Spanish for an Italian saint.

March 22 - The cornerstone is laid for the Victor Emmanuel Monument in Rome in 1885. It is also the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

March 28 - Wealthy Roman senator Didius Julianus "buys" the emperorship from the Praetorian Guard in 193 AD He is later beheaded when a Roman general from North Africa demands the imperial purple.

March 31 - American race-car driver Ralph DePalma dies in 1956. In 1919, DePalmas broke the record for one mile at 149.875 mph. He won 2,557 races out of 2,889 during his lifetime.
