

Dear Member:

For those of you who have followed the Institute's homage to Italian greatness over the years, I offer you a perfect example of our leading-edge philosophy. You may recall that we spotted Marine General Anthony Zinni back in 1997 when he was involved

in the Somalia evacuation. The Institute honored him in 1998 along with the Italian Chief of Staff Admiral Venturoni at one of our galas. General Zinni is now up to his elbows in the Middle East as President Bush's personal envoy. For the record, Zinni didn't sell one table at the gala. He didn't bring in one journal ad. We did not honor

him for his ability to sell tickets for us. We honored him because he represented all that is excellent about our heritage. This is what separates us from the other organizations. Ironically, Zinni's ancestors hailed from Abruzzo, the same Italian region that Pontius Pilate called home. Not much in the Middle East has changed in 2,000 years.

On the lighter side, we have begun the new year with some new initiatives. You'll find one of them enclosed. *The Last Sucker* is a cartoon satire aimed at Hollywood. Offered up to the various media by snail mail and e-mail, *The Last Sucker* carries on the ancient Italian tradition of ribbing our adversaries by way of art. You can visit our website to view a full-color version, as well as the official press release that accompanies it. One picture may be worth 10,000 protest letters.

Our *Aurora* Italian Language and Culture Program for 2001-2002 came to a gratifying conclusion. As you recall, we went into the program right after the 9/11 tragedy with a major cut in New York City grants. I am happy to announce that due to the extraordinary efforts of our *Aurora* Director Tony DeNonno, City Council Budget

Director Frank Tramantano, and the generosity of our members, we squeezed through another year. Tony's persistence gained us a miraculous \$20,000 grant from Health Plus, an HMO led by CFO Frank Mascara. This is what can happen when Italian Americans get in synch! Special donations also came in from the S. Antonio Abate Castrofilippi Society (\$1,000) and the Italian Club of Staten Island (\$750). We are proud to be the only, repeat, ONLY organization in the United States that has such an extensive after-school system for Italian heritage. Others give money away, we give education.

Among our other initiatives, soon to be released, is a study on Italian American progress since the 1980's. It was prompted by a casual remark made by Bill Tonelli of the *Village Voice*. Tonelli is a firm believer that this is the best of all possible worlds (i.e., a cockeyed optimist). He has convinced himself that media stereotyping and defamation have not adversely affected Italian American progress. Our study, the *Gianelli-Cardillo Report*, will examine this opinion.

And we haven't forgotten *The Italic Way* Magazine. It has been laid out and the articles are in progress. I'll refrain from promising a deadline, but late spring seems reasonable.

I wish to leave you with one thought. Last year, Robert Mondavi, the world-renowned vintner, gave \$35 million to a California university for a wine laboratory and fine arts program. Last year, businessman Dennis Tito spent \$20 million to ride into space. Ten years ago, an Italian American businessman spent \$20 million to run for governor of New York (he lost). A few years back, shopping center magnate Edward DeBartolo, Sr., gave Notre Dame \$30 million. Had these men and scores of other multi-millionaires had the pride of heritage and some faith in Italian American organizations, we would soon begin acting like the fifth largest ethnic group in America. Is the problem with our millionaires or with us? We shall explore this question further. In the meantime, thank you for any and all donations. They are, unquestionably, a greater sacrifice on your part than a proportionate amount from the truly wealthy.





#### **April Almanac**

- **April 8 -** Jurist **Pasquale Fiore** is born in 1837. His expertise and writings about international law had a profound influence on the legal systems of all Latin countries in Europe and the Americas.
- April 9 British engineer Sebastian Ferranti is born in 1864. He promoted and oversaw the development of England's AC power grid.
  - Enrico Tonti and Robert LaSalle reach the mouth of the Mississippi River in 1682. LaSalle was later murdered by his French crew. Thereafter, Tonti spent 25 years developing middle America, which eventually was sold to the United States as the Louisiana Purchase.
- April 11 Italian military aviator Renato Donati sets the high altitude record of 47,352 feet in 1934.
- April 13 Italian-American inventor Antonio Meucci is born in 1808. Living in Staten Island, NY, Meucci files the first papers for his teletrofono (telephone) five years before Alexander Graham Bell.
- April 14 Topo Gigio, the Italian mouse, premieres on the Ed Sullivan Show in 1964.
- **April 16 -** Composer **Henry Mancini** is born in 1924. His hits included *The Pink Panther Theme*, *Moon River*, and *Days of Wine and Roses*.
  - Italian monk Giovanni Francesco Bernardone founds the Franciscan Order in 1209.
- **April 17 Giovanni da Verrazzano** is the first European to enter New York Harbor in 1524, eighty-five years before Henry Hudson.
- **April 21 -** The city of **Rome** is founded in 753 B.C. She later became the creator of the nation-state of Italy.
- April 15 Inventor of wireless telegraphy, Guglielmo Marconi, is born in Bologna in 1875.
- April 26 Italy signs the Secret Treaty of London in 1915 in which France and Britain promises Italy overseas colonies in return for its participation in the First World War. The Allies reneged on the pledge even after Italy defeated Austria-Hungary and lost 600,000 servicemen.
- April 27 Heavyweight boxer Rocky Marciano retires undefeated in 1956.
- **April 30** Freedom fighter **Romolo Gessi** is born in 1831. This soldier/explorer led numerous expeditions for the British in Africa freeing 30,000 slaves from bondage.
