Re: Struggle at the United Nations

Dear Member,

On September 16th, the Institute was invited by NIACA (National Italian-American Coordinating Association) to join their efforts to reverse the Clinton Administration's current plan to expand the U.N. Security Council. That plan would sponsor Germany and Japan as new permanent members (joining the UK, U.S., France, China and Russia). Italy, the 5th largest contributor to the U.N. budget, and a key participant in peacekeeping expeditions to Somalia, Bosnia, Lebanon, Mozambique, and Albania, would effectively be shunted to a second-class status.

In light of our Institute's recent celebration, in May, of Italy's new global peacekeeping role (we honored U.N. Ambassador Francesco Fulci), the Council of Governors asks your support of the NIACA initiative by signing the attached petition.

Please call on your friends and family to sign the petition, an appeal to the U.S. government. Return completed petitions to our office as soon as possible.

Italian-Americans, the fifth largest ethnic group in the United States, should honor Italy's global peacekeeping record. Who has been a more dependable and loyal ally of the United States?

All the major Italian-American organizations are committed to this cause. Let us be heard too.

It all started a few years ago when the Italian-American faculty at CUNY complained of discrimination in hiring and promotion policies. To avoid a lawsuit, the university made an agreement to mend its ways. Unfortunately, the mending was more imaginary than real.

Scelsa and his attorneys have recently forced the issue with a court summons. The court has since rejected CUNY's appeal to dismiss the case.

- Oct. 6 World Champion wrestler Bruno Sammartino was born in Pittsburgh in 1936.
- Oct. 9 Candido Jacuzzi, inventor of the whirlpool bath, died in 1986, at the age of 83.
- Oct. 10 Composer Giuseppe Verdi, composer of Aida, La Traviata, et. al., is born in 1813.
- Oct. 12 Italian navigator Cristoforo Colombo lands in the New World. His voyage was partly financed by Italian merchants in Spain as well as the Spanish government.
- Oct. 15 On this day in 1764, standing amid the ruins of ancient Rome, the English historian Edward Gibbon was inspired to begin writing the Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire.
- Oct. 23 Capt. Carlo Piazza became the first aviator to fly a combat mission in war, during the Italo-Turk war of 1911.
- Oct. 25 Heavyweight champion of the world (1933-34) Primo Carnera was born in Italy in 1906. The huge fighter was nicknamed "The Ambling Alp." He lost his crown to Joe Louis.
