His extensive experience in Italian-American organizations in the Chicago area makes him a welcome resource. It is our desire that Robert, as a newcomer to New York, will be helpful in re-energizing relationships here.

In other news, long-time member **Charles Guigno**, Vice President and Director of Operations at the Empire State Building, has offered to be Dinner Chairman for our 1998 Gala. Charles will have the able assistance of **Michael Cafiero**, President of PC Couriers, Inc. as Vice Chairman. Lucio Caputo of GEI (Italian Exporters Group) will also serve as a Vice Chairman.

#### **UNITED NATIONS - STATUS REPORT**

On 12/1, a delegation of leaders of Italian-American organizations assembled in front of the United States Embassy, across the street from the United Nations in New York, to join NY Senator Alfonse D'Amato and Congressman Bill Pascrell in protesting the exclusion of Italy, in favor of Japan and Germany, from consideration in an American proposal to reorganize the UN Security Council. The next day a petition with 55,000 signatures was delivered to the White House. This petition included some 1,000 names supplied by Italic Studies Institute members. The Clinton Administration's rush to reorganize the Council was tabled for this session. Our lobbying efforts, in concert with NIACA (National Italian American Coordinating Association) will continue in 1998.

#### SENATOR'S APOLOGY RECEIVED

ISI member Steve Napolitano received Senator John Kerry's (D-MA) official apology for some degrading remarks made on radio's *Imus Show*. Speaking of a possible war against Iraq, Kerry observed that the Iraqi Army is so weak that "even the Italians could kick their butts." The fact that a United States Senator unconsciously maintains the vestige of WW II British propaganda demonstrates the power of stereotyping.

Italy is a NATO ally and has participated quite successfully in three major military operations with the United States during the past 15 years.

#### THEY ALSO WRITE

There is no question that the quality of our membership is excellent. At least three of you out there have published books recently or are working toward that end.

Dr. Frank D'Alessandro, M.D., of N. Providence, Rhode Island has written The Verdict of History on Sacco and Vanzetti, a new analysis of the tragic trial that sent two innocent immigrants to the electric chair in 1927. Dr. D'Alessandro's book contains a disturbing message about the American trial system even to our day.

Anthony Pansini of Waco, Texas, already the author of a number of voluminous works, including Macchiavelli's role in the formation of the United States Constitution, has just published his latest work, *The Duce's Dilemma*, an analysis of Mussolini's decision to enter the Second World War on the side of Germany.

Donato De Simone of Norristown, PA informs us that he is working on a World War II book based on his firsthand experiences as a child in war-torn Italy. Most of his remembrances are currently written in Italian, but he plans a translation into English as well.

## JANUARY ALMANAC

Named after the Roman god Janus, who was depicted with two faces, one looking to the past, the other to the future.

- Jan. 1 Patron of the Renaissance Lorenzo de Medici was born in Florence 1449.
- Boxer **Rocky Graziano** was born in 1922 in New York City. He became the Middleweight Champion of the world in 1947.
- Jan. 3 Benito Mussolini assumes dictatorial powers in 1925.
- Jan 7 Scientist Galileo Galilei identifies the four moons of Jupiter in 1610.
- **Jan. 8 Marco Polo** dies in Venice in 1324, after a life of travel and adventure. His tales of the Orient inspired all of Europe to search for shorter routes to East Asia. The discovery of America was one of the surprising results.
- **Jan. 11 -** Italian-American author **Bernard DeVoto** was born in 1897. His book, *Across the Wide Missouri* became a movie starring Kirk Douglas.
- **Jan. 12** Mathematician **Giorgio Ricci-Curbastro** was born in 1853. He developed Absolute Differential Calculus, which was the basis for Einstein's Theory of Relativity.
- **Jan. 13 -** Roman general **Gaius Marius** dies in 86 BC. His reforms converted the Roman legions from a citizen draft to a professional army.
- **Jan. 18** Italian admiral **Francesco Caracciolo** was born in Naples in 1752. As a soldier of fortune he fought on the British side during the American Revolution.
- Jan. 20 Fr. Alessandro Volignano died at the Portuguese colony of Macau, near Hong Kong, in 1606. He was the first Christian missionary to Japan and is credited with some 300,000 conversions. Jan. 25 Mathematician Giuseppe Luigi La Grangia (aka LaGrange) was born in Torino in 1736. During the French Revolution he chaired the committee that developed the Metric System.
